
We are at present adding to the learner friendly nature of our campus with areas for small group study and the Undercroft, an area for students to quietly study or relax.



We had many successful outcomes from our participation in the TIS talent search program with students progressing through to different phases & being selected to join development squads.







After the initial moving of equipment, resources and three counsellors, Marilyn, Jason and Rosie have established an accessible and busy centre.


It took a little while for some students to locate us, however, we have now become part of F Block and Room

Launceston College we encourage participation in mathematics competitions throughout the year as this helps to challenge students and bring out their best in terms of mathematical achievement. In order to support and prepare students for these competitions Phillipa Pitt held lunchtime tutorials each week during the first two terms of the year. These tutorials have inherent benefits for all of the students who attend; they inevitably improve their logic and prob-

lem- solving skills and increase their chance of success in the mathematics competitions. Students have also

been supported in their mathematical endeavours by a group of dedicated Launceston College teachers who have given up their time to run mathematics



School in the State Senior Secondary Division for the second year in a row. Other Launceston


College teams were also placed

Qi . Congratulations to all the competitors as it was a great team effort by all involved.






artistic talents with a sharp piece of plas-

and who could forget the Trivia Night on the last evening with the Marine Studies students?!




But most of all, everyone had a great




for her. I guarantee, you will laugh till you cry every lesson, and you will make life long friends, and you will never regret it....much.

This year the VET Hospitality class was comprised of 17 students, six front of house and eleven back of house. It is a practical and hands on experience in the hospitality industry. The program involved a lot of out of class time as well as in class. Throughout the year we have held many functions. In term two we opened the restaurant nearly every Thursday with light lunches including: Gourmet, Taste of Asia, Pasta, Soups and Breads and Mexican. We also opened the restaurant for private functions.



end of term one as reward for their efforts. Tourism Studies activities have included many visits to local tourist attractions and accommodation houses and several guest speakers. Many of the



LAUNCESTON COLLEGE

90 YEARS OF STATE EDUCATION

Launceston College has much to celebrate this year. 2003 marks 90 years of state secondary education in northern Tasmania. The College has undergone great change, particularly in the last few decades but the main building with its palm trees would still be recognised by the original students who attended the opening of the new buildings in Paterson Street on March 23, 1916. These original students have now passed on but the tradition of scholarship, sportsmanship and leadership in their communities has been an abiding legacy to the present day.

Prior to the first decade of the 20th Century, private schools like Hutchins and Grammar were the sole providers of secondary education in Tasmania. They provided education to university entrance standard for the sons and daughters of the professional and commercial elite. Many people saw no need for the state to provide education beyond grade 6, because an educated working class was bound to upset the social order. Too much education made for discontented workers – "the rich man in his castle, the poor man at his gate!"

By 1910 this preordained order of things was coming under increasing challenge. The need for good citizens in the new century meant that all children should be given the opportunity for secondary education. It was relatively easy for the Tasmanian Director of Education, W.T. McCoy to argue the demand for education beyond grade 6 had built up since Federation. There were hundreds of intelligent and capable children who would benefit from an education beyond grade 6. Even the University acquiesced to McCoy's proposal because more students made for a more viable institution and standards would be maintained through the control of the Junior and Senior Public examinations. A natural progression then, led to the establishment of State High Schools in 1913. Hobart High School opened with 150 students and Launceston with 104.

At first, Launceston High shared facilities with the Charles Street School and later junior pupils were accommodated at Milton Hall in Frederick Street. When the school opened on the Paterson Street site in March 1916, the Minister for Education, Joe Lyons was able to boast that, "Here in Tasmania we are pulling down gaols and putting up schools." Furthermore, he contended that "...equality of opportunity is one of the first principles of democracy..." It is this principle which has guided the school and college through nine decades. Recently, there has been a drift back to private schools and the celebration of 90 years on is a reaffirmation of the value of open and free state secondary education for all.

Launceston High School, 1913-1966 had five headmasters during this period. Of these, R.O.M. Miller 1913 to 1928 was perhaps the most significant because he established the traditions of the school and fought for parity of esteem with the private schools, not only in scholarship but also in sport and community leadership. The next most important leader was A.L. Meston, a true gentleman-scholar. Arch Meston had been on the staff with headmaster Miller from 1916 and was able to continue and build on the traditions established earlier during his headship from 1932-1938. To quote from 60 Years On "He brought to the school a first rate intelligence combined with a sensible and humane philosophy of education." Another distinguished head was Carl Morris, 1939-1952. This was a period of great expansion for the school both physically and numerically. Carl Morris was perhaps the most loved head of the school because he exuded kindliness and concern for every pupil and teacher under his control. The last head of Launceston High was Lew Amos (1953-1967). In some ways, Lew Amos is best compared to Billy Hughes,

that

"fiery particle". Lew was less
cantankerous than Prime Minister Hughes but
he was just as energetic. He was everywhere and knew
everything about every individual in the school. He truly had his
finger on the pulse! He personified and often quoted the aphorism,
"Reach for the stars and you will hit the treetops; reach for the treetops and
you will remain on the ground."

Launceston Matriculation College existed from 1967-1979. The high school had blown out to 1200 students but by 1967 all the pre-matriculation classes had been absorbed by Prospect High School and 450 students were enrolled in years 11 and 12 under the banner *Launceston Matriculation College*.

Looking through the *Churinga* magazines of the Matric College period, I find little dramatic change from the achievements and expectations of the High School. Emphasis was on academic success and encouraging or cajoling as many students as possible to achieve university entrance. A new library was opened and other spaces were modified to cope with more than 800 students by 1975. The Principal from 1970, K.J. Walker placed much greater emphasis on student rights and the right to criticize and protest became a part of the norm. Students were expected to govern themselves and to accept responsibility for their actions.

By the late 1970s this matriculation formula was beginning to break down. Fewer than half of the students went on to tertiary study. There was a real need to provide better courses for students with vocational aims or other goals, or no particular goals at all! A bold political experiment amalgamated LMC with the Technical College and Adult Education to create a hybrid called *Launceston Community College*. The acting Principal, Colin Lane put the best possible spin on these new developments in the editorial of the 1980 *Churinga*, yet the doubters were already evident on page 2. S.A. wrote "...At this stage I feel that 1980 has been a year in which foundations were laid for a Community College. Whether this foundation remains strong and is built upon or crumbles remains to be seen." It took only 6 years for the whole edifice to come crashing down. Out of this political witches' brew emerged the present *Launceston College*. The attempt to create a single post-grade 10 educational institution to suit everybody was clearly unworkable. TAFE training and other tertiary courses were best handled by TAFE. The most positive thing to come out of the whole process was the redevelopment of the Paterson Street site into the multifunction Launceston College we know today.

In reading the 2002 *Churinga* I was impressed by the range of courses and activities available to students today. The three main areas, university, vocational and open learning are vibrant learning centres with up-to-the minute facilities and resources to move with changing times. Recent administrative changes have led to a reintegration of the three main areas into a whole college structure. As in 1913, Launceston College provides opportunities for all students who have the ability and will to succeed.

As one of the first mature age students to attend the College in 1965 and 1966 I have many fond memories of my time there. The excellence of the teaching changed my life and led me to appreciate education as an end in itself.






Media Video



As well as gaining experience in television


production students also experimented in other areas of media, including, claymation, puppet films, animation and music videos. Another action packed year

ple this year. The humour level has been high and it has been a challenge to contain so much rampant energy at times, but it has definitely been worth it. Best wishes for your future.



During the term, we enjoyed performances of *Sound and Fury, Banjo* and *Conviction* as well as other offerings as part of the 10 Days on the Island


Festival.
