




The top 10% of the teams were invited to participate in the National Competition.

These placements helped us to further understand the classroom theory and activities.





Academic Award Geremony

The achievement of over 70 exceptional students was recognised at the Academic Award Ceremony on February 6 at Launceston College. Principal Keith Wenn spoke about the challenges facing Tasmania's colleges as they seek to offer the best learning opportunities for all students in a rapidly changing world. He highlighted the fact that 82 students had gained a TE Rank of 80 or more- a considerable achievement.

Launceston College's TCE results showed the students' commitment to excellence and hard work. Fifty-one students gained subject awards for an EA for a level 5 subject, with 16 of them showing success in more than one subject. The inaugural Launceston Advanced Academic Diploma was awarded to Nicholas Hamilton, Ashlin Lee, Adam Marshall, Huon McGifford, Keiren Mitchell, Rebekah Moore and Margot Tidey.

In the Special Awards category congratulations went to Zoe Bok (Lewis Bardenhagen Prize for English), Alex Males (Old Scholars Maths/ Science Prize), Roisin Mortimer (Edward Wesley Prize for Music), Tom Bock (Cameron's Accounting Prize) and William Head (CPA Business Prize).

The runner up to the dux was Zoe Bok with a TE Rank of 99.5. Alex Males was a very worthy winner of the accolade, Dux for 2007, with a TE Rank of 99.8.

The student hosts for the evening were Jackie Bennett and Jackson Milne. The College's new grand piano was showcased by performances from Ben Austin and Roisin Mortimer, while Lyndon Riggall performed a comic monologue. Featured poets in the Program were Crystal Adams and Nieka Bishop.




