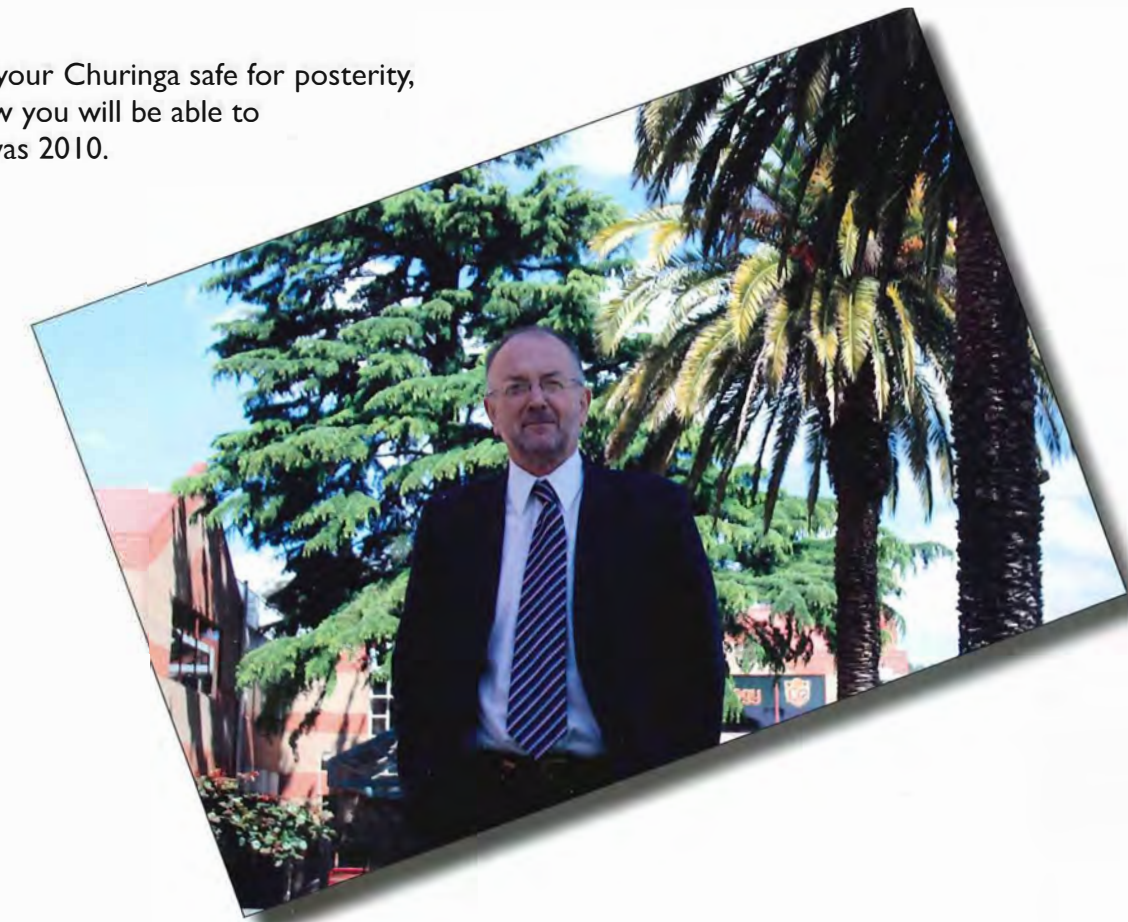

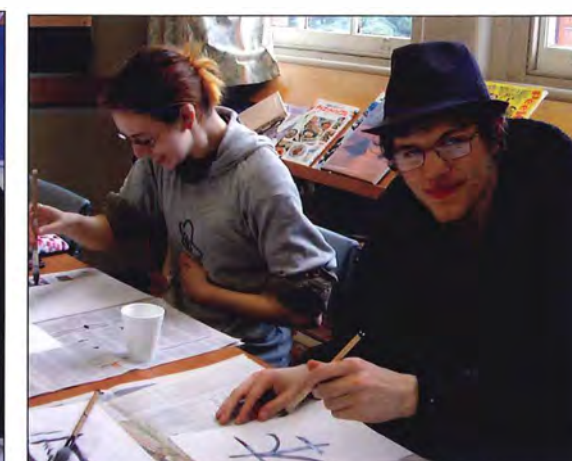
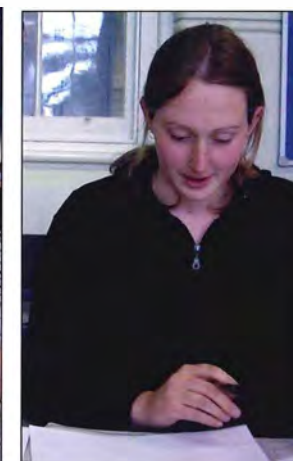

Two classes of Japanese operated this year, with many students challenging themselves and learning as much of the language as they could.

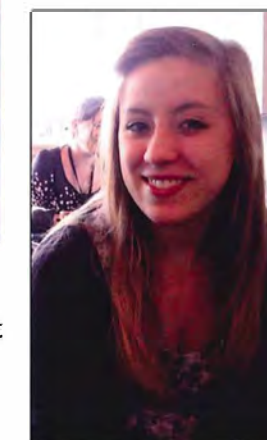
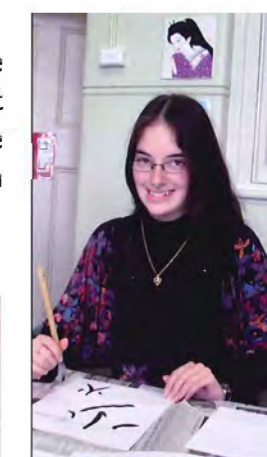


Beginners were surprised how much they could read and write after less than a year of study, and some pre-tertiary students were very pleased with their personal progress.

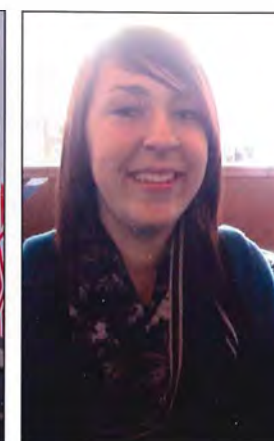


Congratulations to:

Students gain experience in both back of house and front of house skills including cooking and presenting cafe style food for sale.

As the Cafe caters for functions, the students have had an opportunity to present their skills at such occasions as Learning Area meetings, Orientation Days, invited guests of the College and College Production Celebrations



Many students have elected to attend the Cafe course throughout the year and this has led to employment opportunities for them within the local community.

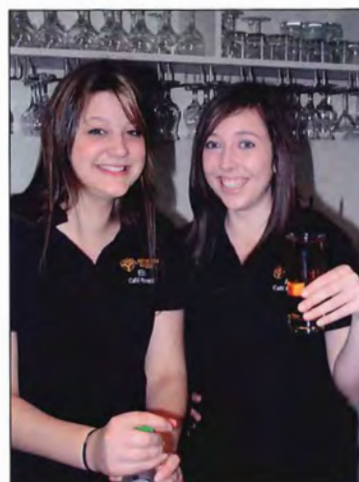
Student comments:

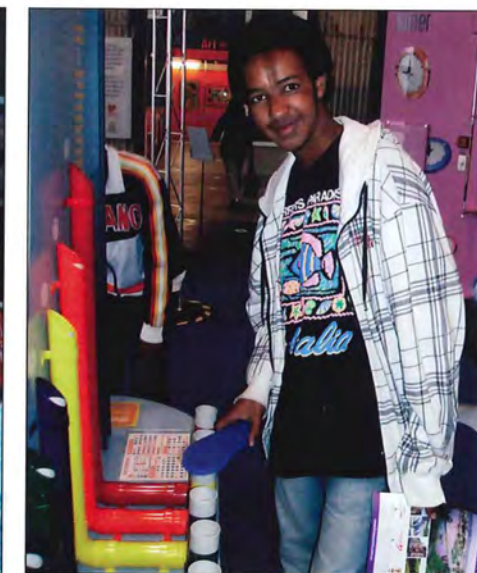

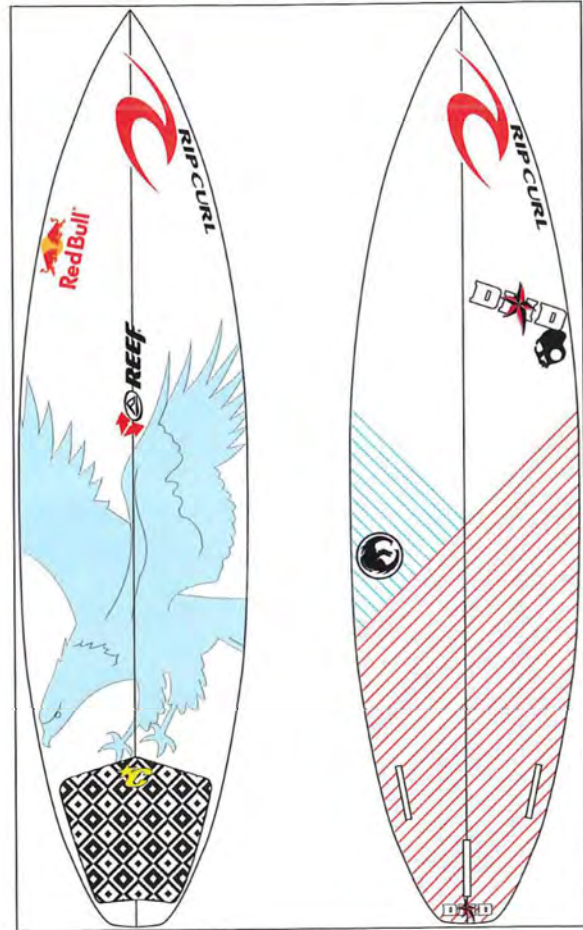

- and lots and lots and lots of appointments!





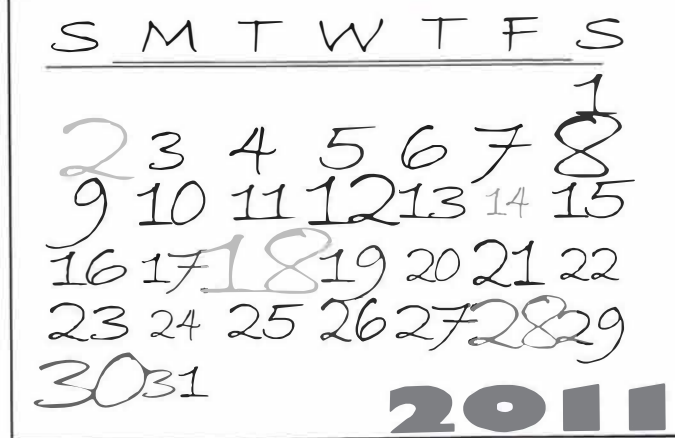

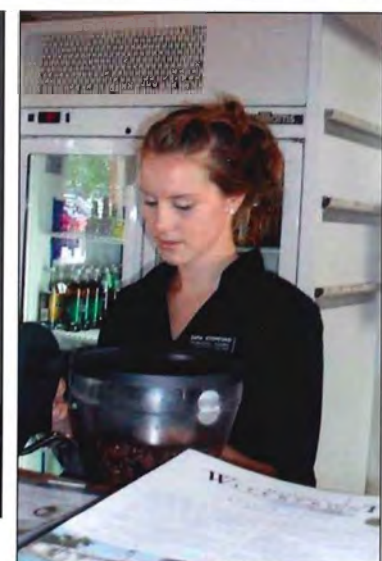
The class of 2010 students has been committed to achieving nationally recognised hospitality qualifications by participating in a wide range of training activities in both on and off the job environments.

This year three classes studied Working with Children and participated in running the College Playgroup as part of their course. This allowed the students to work with babies and children up to 5 years old.

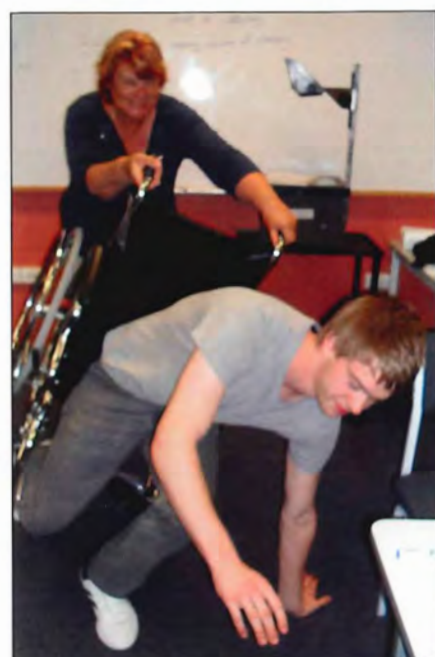

Launceston College students featured in the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra's **Student Composition Competition**. Students were required to compose a piece for string quartet inspired by animals. Four students from Launceston College entered the competition and completed works of high calibre. Laura Sykes, Melissa Goodger, Andrew Deavin and Myles Flood were able to produce creative works entitled 'Yolla', 'The Valley of Calling', 'The Legend of Tabmow' and 'Felis Silvestris Catus'. Works by Melissa Goodger and Andrew Deavin were highly commended and selected as finalists.

These works and another by Callum Tully (*Mellow Strings*) were regarded as complex and student musicians were having difficulty in learning to perform these works. Conservatorium staff, led by the head of String Chamber Music Jeremy Williams, came to the rescue offering to record the students' works. The composers were astounded and exuberant at listening to their works being performed and interpreted so masterfully and musically within a two hour period. Jeremy Williams along with the other chamber players, congratulated the students on composing such substantial works and commented that the standard of works was equal to those produced by Conservatorium composition students. These compositions along with other works were featured at the College's annual *Young Composers Concert* held at Launceston College's Music Department (E block) on Friday October 22nd.

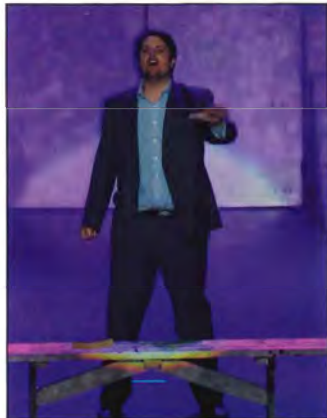

The plaque now hangs by the grand piano in E block (E213).


The two level two music classes also held separate recitals for parents and friends in late August. Students learning instruments for the first time along with more experienced players gave their first ever public performance as soloists and ensemble members. The audiences were highly appreciative of the performers and the event gave those musicians who normally do not have opportunities to showcase their work, performance experience in an enthusiastic and supportive environment. From the results of the mid-year assessment by Conservatorium staff, the Launceston College students are heading towards Distinctions and High Distinctions!


Congratulations to all music students who have continued to work creatively and passionately to maintain a highly exciting cultural environment and high standards in the Performing Arts at Launceston College.

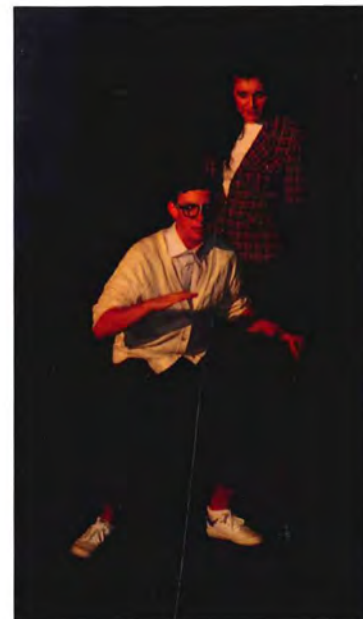

While studying the Driving for Work unit, students have had the opportunity to gain their learners licence as well as develop an understanding of buying and running a car and general road safety.

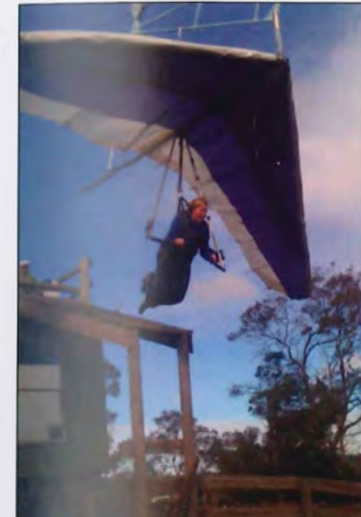

The year has been very successful. A number of students have found employment and students have reacted positively to the life challenges presented in the course.

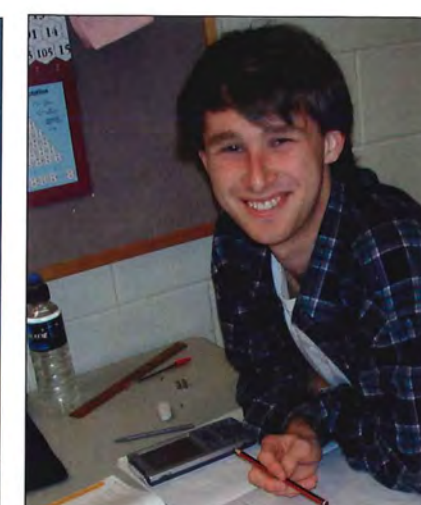
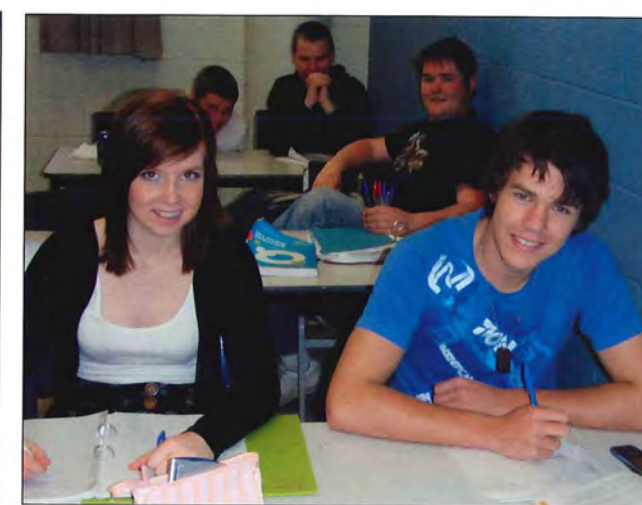
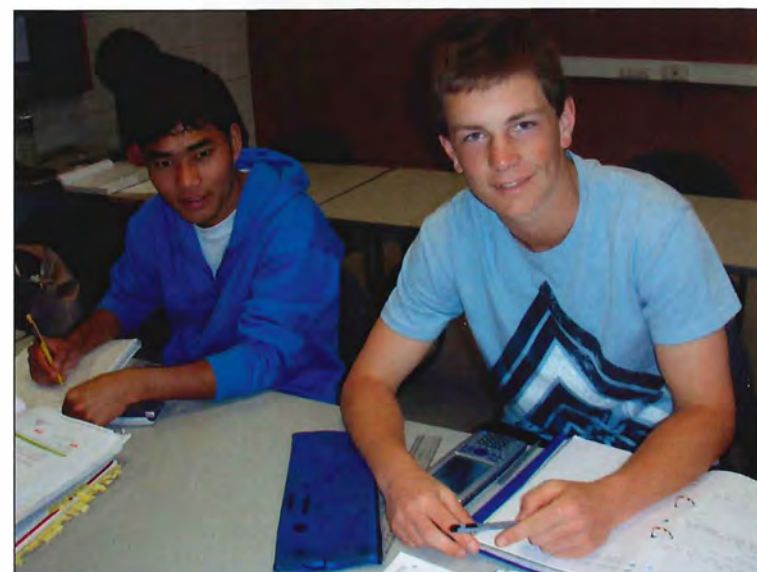




784 students enrolled in a Maths subject at LC in 2010. The most popular subject was Maths Applied 3 with 236 enrolments.

Students participated in a number of Maths activities outside of class. These included the Maths Relay held in August where two teams of students each performed very well on the 20 question competition.

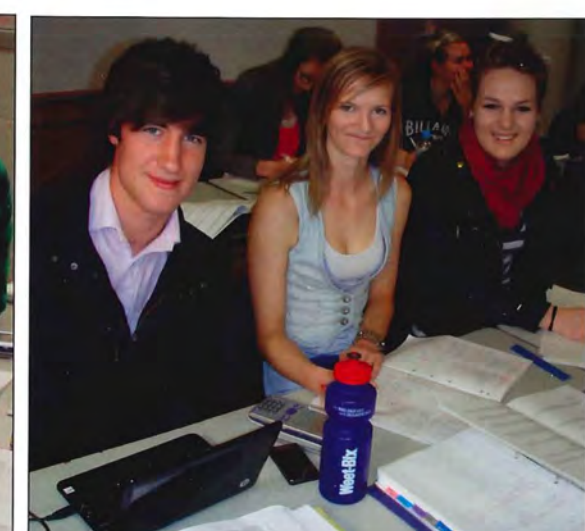
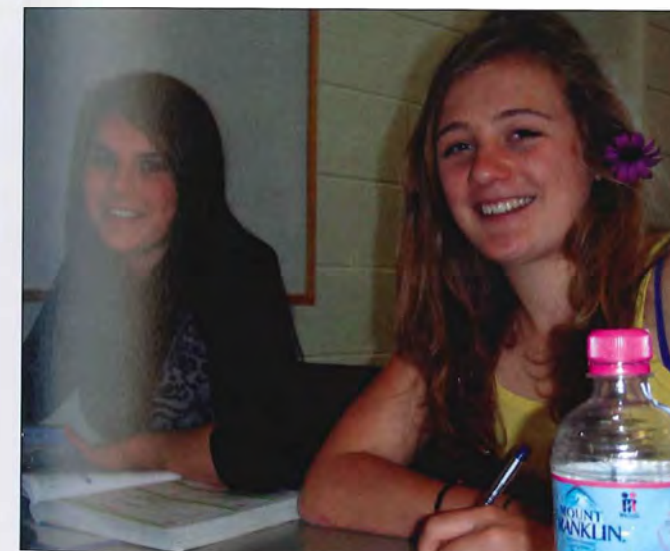

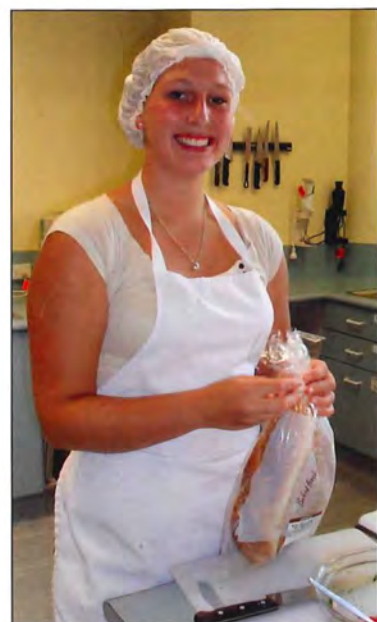
The international students have been busy this year focussing on their studies.

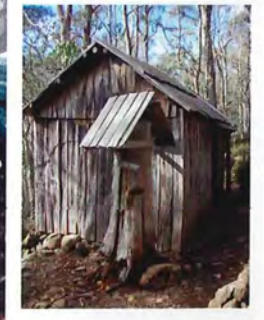
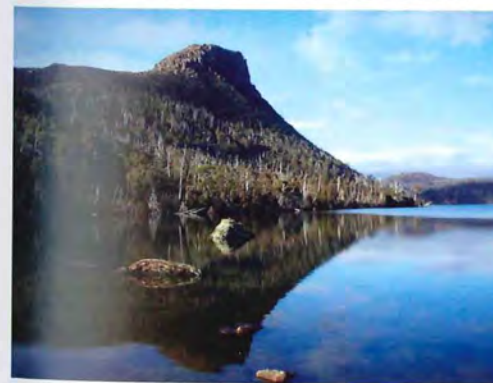
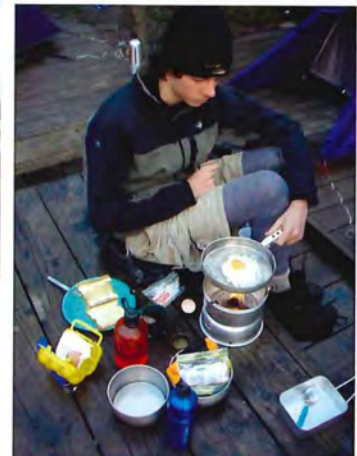

We have also had Tristan McCarthy selected to represent Launceston College at the National Science Youth Forum which will be held in January 2011 at Perth WA.

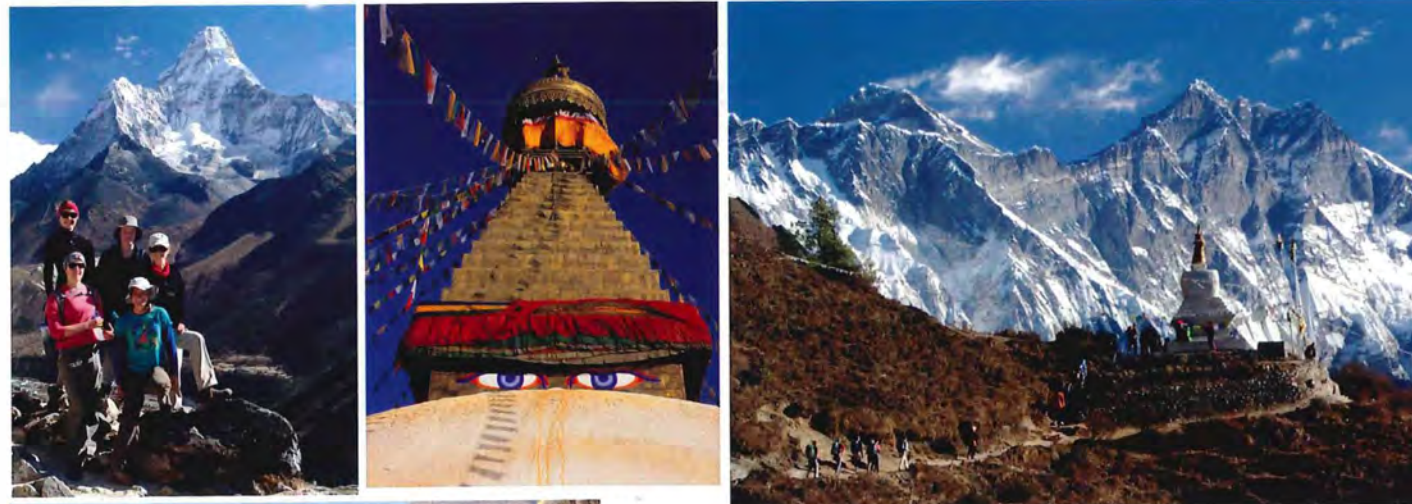

VET Electrotechnology has continued to have students develop electronic and other programs designed to help them into work through the Certification processes.

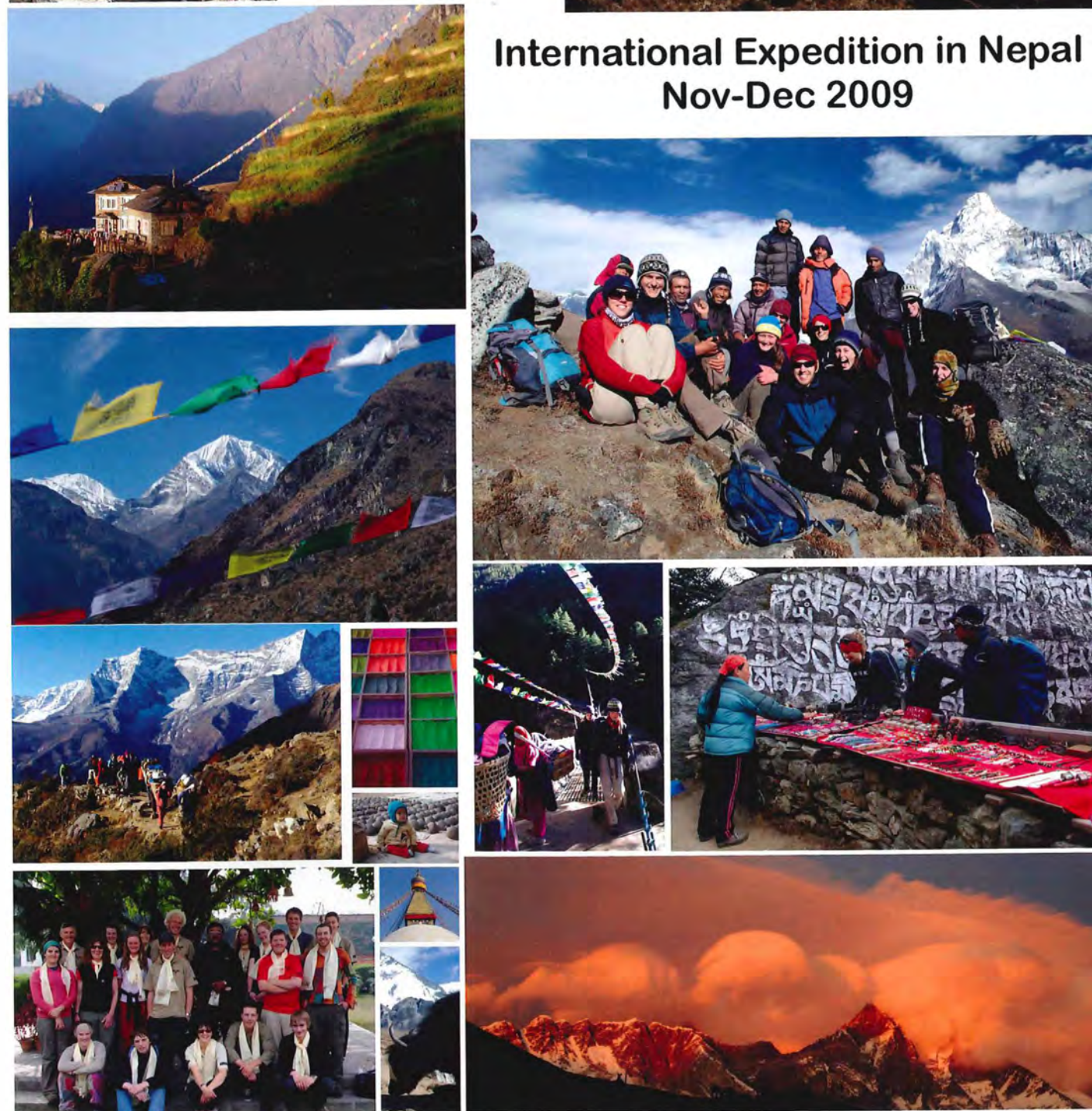

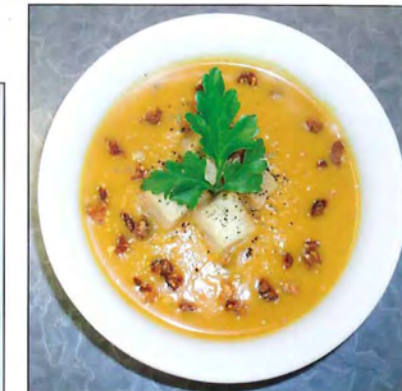
Whirlpool Success for LC students

professional in their black 'Elcies' hospitality uniform.

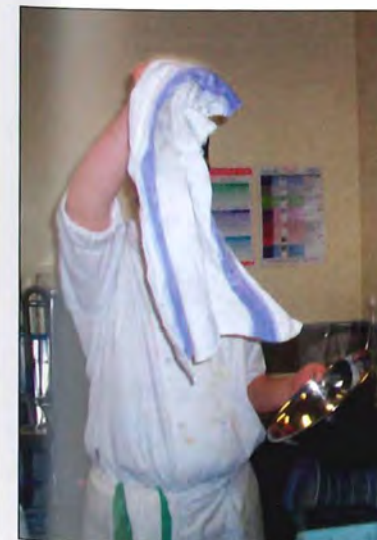

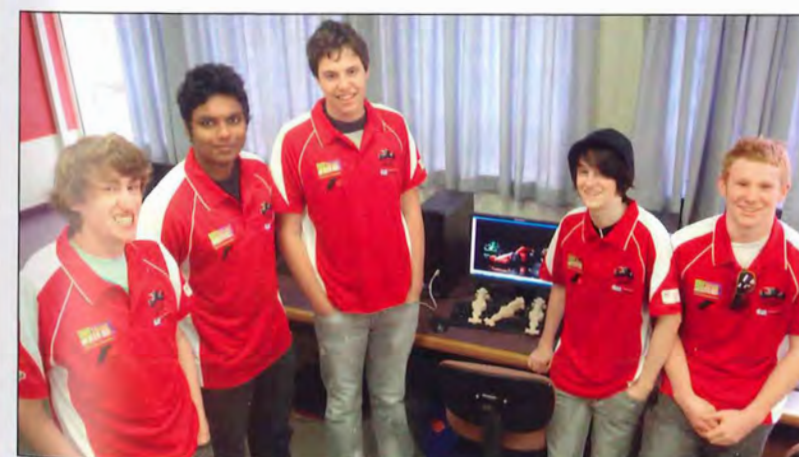
