



Our philosophy has been to retain the core values and strengths of the past whilst at the same time developing programs and infrastructure to meet ever changing educational and training needs of the future.

The result is a university style environment and facilities that rate amongst the best in the state.

We also plan to celebrate the opening of this specific site in 2015.

Please keep an eye on the local media for the launch of the Centenary website and in as many ways possible, inform our broad alumni of the upcoming celebrations, so they too can become involved.


Meanwhile, our wonderful class of 2011 join the ranks of thousands of Tasmanians who are alumni of this college. We wish you the very best for your future.




Lauren Hesp, winner of the 2011 Snap Photographic Competition which is a state-wide competition open to Year 9-12 students.














Performing Arts Music Summer School

Over 400 students from Launceston College, eleven primary schools and two high schools performed to a capacity crowd in the Princess Theatre.





INTERNATIONAL EXPEDITION - NEPAL

Following the end of year TQA external exams, these adventurous outdoor education and outdoor leadership students will have their bags packed and be flying off to undertake an expedition in the Everest region of Nepal. It's a journey of personal discovery, a preparation for a challenging future.

International Expedition in Nepal has been an integral part of the outdoor education program at Launceston College for the past 16 years; it's about international adventure travel for students. The concept was initiated and implemented by Mick Ling, Outdoor Education coordinator at Launceston College and enables students participating in the expedition to gain accreditation in the TQA subject Outdoor Education (Expedition) 2.

Students learn about leadership, gain self-confidence, are challenged to make decisions, show initiative and take responsibility. They discover the value of patience, humour and teamwork, gain a finer appreciation of their own country and learn more about themselves and about achieving goals. Above all else, they will enjoy the adventure of being alive and having a lot of fun!



In signing up for a 23 day expedition to Nepal, these students are broadening their horizons. Nepal presents students with a range of experiences and challenges - cultural, physical, environmental and intellectual - it's about discovering new places, new people, travel and adventure.

The trip is organised through the Australian international adventure travel company **World Expeditions**, and over the years the expedition has significantly benefitted from the ongoing staff and product support provided by the local outdoor adventure equipment retailers **Paddy Pallin** and **Mountain Designs**, with **Tassie Tees** responsible for the eye catching expedition t-shirt.

This a classic Himalayan trek in the Everest region of Nepal, challenging and rewarding. Students experience an exhilarating Himalayan flight from Kathmandu to Lukla (and return), interacting with Sherpa culture and wandering through Namche Bazaar and its captivating markets. Apart from enjoying the spectacular mountain scenery and glaciers of the Khumbu region, students spend time in local villages, a school and hospital, and Thyangboche Monastery (Tibetan Buddhist). A highlight of the trek will be climbing Gokyo Ri (5483m), providing stunning views of Mount Everest and the surrounding massive 8000m peaks of Makalu, Lhotse and Cho Oyu.

In Kathmandu students will explore the numerous World Heritage Sites (more than any other city in the world) – such as Durbar Square, Swayambhunath (the Monkey Temple), Pashupatinath (a major Hindu shrine) and the giant Buddhhist stupa at Bodnath – and the extensive markets, excellent book shops and handicrafts, and fascinating centres of cultural and spiritual significance.

Rather than the journey of a lifetime, the International Expedition in Nepal should be the first of many such journeys students will undertake.




DRAMA

The Theatre Performance students then went on to put on mid year shows in May – with Line 2 presenting a beautiful play *Coram Boy* and Line 4 a hysterical version of *A Mid Summer Nights Dream*.

A highlight of the year was the production of *Romeo* and *Juliet* at the Princess Theatre in April. Students involved worked with theatre professionals Michael Edgar, Jane Johnson, Travis Hennessey and Frank Kerr, who both mentored the students and also acted in the show with them.

Notable performers were Bonnie Harris who was phenomenal as Juliet; Catherine Binns who was perfect as The Nurse; Jake Pike, Dominic Bratzel and Josh Rae who all shone as the young males; and Alex Thompson, Rennie Watson and Toby Heiniger in smaller but beautifully performed roles. Stage managed by Adelle Enniss the show was a chance for our amazing technical theatre class to have hands on experience of putting on a show. Nicole Lewis our Drama teacher also directed the play Osama the Hero for CentrStage which starred Cheyne Mitchell and Year 12 student Ella Hunt.

Competitions and a Melbourne Trip. The trip included workshops at VCA, the Tutankhamen exhibition and theatre shows Rock of Ages and Next to Normal. Another real highlight was our first night bowling and Karaoke night.







The College Production was in June, where our technical theatre students, lead by

Bradley Good and Michael Booth as stage managers, once again were able to demonstrate their considerable skills. The Drama 3 class then put on their mid year show Beach. The show was an exploration of the place of the Australian beach in our culture and history. The students worked well together to pull of this challenging play, which they also have to write about in their written exam. Drama 3 students Will Nicholson and Emma Handley also travelled to Canada as part of SYTT's production of Chasing a Sound like Rain.

At the end of Term 2, Launceston experienced the second Junction Arts Festival. A number of our students were able to get involved in this. Caleb Jones from the tech theatre class was an invaluable asset to the festival team working across a number of areas. We once again hosted an event with Polyglot Theatre from Melbourne putting on How High is the Sky, a show aimed at babies in the Drama room. Rowan Farbrother was seconded to work with them and did an outstanding job. Drama 3 students also helped to run a huge treasure hunt, Seek. Some staff and students are currently working on a project for next year's festival which sees them exploring the concept of Loveliness and passing it on.

At the time of writing the Drama 2 students are busy preparing their children's theatre, Sleeping Beauty, to be performed in early November to hundreds of primary school students in our out door theatre. Lessons learnt from working with Polyglot will be employed in the show – with the set being built from cardboard and the use of helium balloons to create

a forest. All pre tertiary classes are busy working on their end of year exams.





Alex Thompson finished off two years of outstanding musical theatre work by winning the Launceston Musical Society Judy Yates Award, an outstanding achievement.

At the end of the year it is always hard to say goodbye to our Year 12 students and this year is particularly hard as our students are so connected to the department and the college.

To all of them, especially those going onto a Performing Arts pathway we wish you all the best and thank you for your contribution. Special mention to our kitchen captains Sean Brown and Hannah Boddell, and to our stalwart Bronwyn Radford.

Also represented were: East Coast Racing including Joshua Male, Brody Mitchell, Tyler Pitstock and Aaron Purton.




competition for Senior Secondary students across Tasmania. Other members of the winning team were Gavin Lewis and Shayan Hekmatshar.


Another competition that our College entered was the Titration Competition but, this time, we didn't score so well. Never mind there is always a next time.





















APPLIED ENGLISH


We hope that Danae's class next year will have the same fun that we have.
