You will work through the following units as part of Technical Theatre Production

Unit 1: WHS Risk Management

Student will explore the basics of workplace Health and Safety in a theatre environment in a practical (and theoretical) environment.

Unit 2: Critiquing Live Theatre

Students explore the technical elements of theatrical production and explore hat makes them successful of otherwise.

Unit 3: Roles and Responsibilities - Stage Management

Students look at different roles within the theatre machine and how to conduct yourself skilfully in those environments

Unit 4: Lighting Design

Students learn specific lighting design skills and implement them in targeted design tasks.

Unit 5: Design Project – End of year plays

Students work as a part of a production team to realise the end of year plays.

ASSESSMENT

Criterion-based assessment helps students see how well they're meeting course outcomes at the end of their study. While there is continuous feedback to guide learning, final assessments focus on showing what students have achieved by the end. Ratings are given as 'A', 'B', or 'C', based on course standards. A 't' indicates partial achievement below a 'C', and a 'z' means no evidence provided.

Schools follow TASC's quality assurance to keep standards consistent. More details are on the <u>TASC website</u>. Final awards are based on both internal and TASC-supervised external assessments.

Criteria

The assessment for Technical Theatre Production Level 2 will be based on the degree to which the learner can:

- 1. work collaboratively as a member of a production team
- 2. record and organise technical theatre production elements, and care for equipment
- 3. identify elements of technical theatre production and their relationships
- 4. apply technical theatre production skills
- 5. apply reflective practice to own role in production team
- 6. appraise use and effect of technical elements in live theatre productions

Award Requirements

The final award will be determined by the Office of Tasmanian Assessment, Standards and Certification from 6 ratings.

The minimum requirements for an award in *Technical Theatre Production* Level 2 are as follows:

EXCEPTIONAL ACHIEVEMENT (EA)

5 'A' ratings, 1 'B' rating

HIGH ACHIEVEMENT (HA)

3 'A' ratings, 2 'B' ratings, 1 'C' rating

COMMENDABLE ACHIEVEMENT (CA)

3 'B' ratings, 3 'C' ratings

SATISFACTORY ACHIEVEMENT (SA)

5 'C' ratings

PRELIMINARY ACHIEVEMENT (PA)

3 'C' ratings

A learner who otherwise achieves the ratings for an SA (Satisfactory Achievement) award but who fails to show any evidence of achievement in one or more criteria ('z' notation) will be issued with a PA (Preliminary Achievement) award.
