You will work through the following units as part of Theatre Performance

Unit 1: Uta Hagen - The Exercises

Intro to the text *Uta Hagen: A Challenge to the Actor* and how we will be using Uta's acting exercises in class to refine our processes of performance.

Unit 2: Monologue one and mid-year Performance

Student begin work on their first monologue and commence a whole class full length play.

Unit 3: Avant-garde

Student's explore the genre of Avant-garde theatre where they will create a small group original Avant theatre work

Unit 4: End of year play and folio

Students realise their end of year full length play and supporting I.R.S (folio) for external examination

Unit 5: Critical Appraisals

Students will critically appraise live theatre performances that we have seen throughout the year

How you'll be assessed:

- Written reflection on tasks
- Performance of text
- Critical appraisals
- 2 x folios (midyear and end of year)

Successful students in Theatre Performance should be able to:

- Develops the ability to articulate ideas clearly in written reflections and performance critiques.
- Demonstrates skill in analysing scripts and performing them.
- Cultivates strong research and writing skills to explore theatrical styles, historical contexts, and character development.

The external assessment for this subject is a full-length play, a contrasting monologue and a 2000-3000 word folio. The dates for external exams in November are non-negotiable.

COMPLELTION OF WORK POLICY

Assessment due dates are provided in the Program of Learning and on Canvas. Work must be submitted by the due date unless an approved extension has been granted. Unapproved late submissions will incur penalties as outlined in the *Completion of Work Policy*. ASSESSMENT

Criterion-based assessment helps students see how well they're meeting course outcomes at the end of their study. While there is continuous feedback to guide learning, final assessments focus on showing what students have achieved by the end. Ratings are given as 'A', 'B', or 'C', based on course standards. A 't' indicates partial achievement below a 'C', and a 'z' means no evidence provided. Schools follow TASC's quality assurance to keep standards consistent. More details are on the <u>TASC</u> website. Final awards are based on both internal and TASC-supervised external assessments.

Criteria

The assessment for *Theatre Performance* Level 3 will be based on the degree to which the learner can:

- 1. use a range of vocal techniques to create character*
- 2. use stagecraft and theatrical production elements in polished performances*
- 3. perform and sustain a range of characters*
- 4. work as a member of a theatrical ensemble
- 5. communicate information about theatrical practice, contexts, styles and genres
- 6. review acting performances in theatrical productions
- 7. appraise own dramatic and performance techniques*

Award Requirements

The final award will be determined by the Office of Tasmanian Assessment, Standards and Certification from 11 ratings (7 from the internal assessment, 4 from the external assessment).

The minimum requirement for an award in *Theatre Performance* Level 3 are as follows:

EXCEPTIONAL ACHIEVEMENT (EA)

10 'A' ratings, 1 'B' rating (with 3 'A' ratings and 1 'B' rating in the external assessment)

HIGH ACHIEVEMENT (HA)

4 'A' ratings, 5 'B' ratings, 2 'C' ratings (with 1 'A' rating, 2 'B' ratings and 1 'C' rating in the external assessment)

COMMENDABLE ACHIEVEMENT (CA)

6 'B' ratings, 4 'C' ratings (with 2 'B' ratings and 1 'C' rating in the external assessment)

SATISFACTORY ACHIEVEMENT (SA)

9 'C' ratings (3 'C' ratings in the external assessment)

PRELIMINARY ACHIEVEMENT (PA)

5 'C' ratings
